INTRODUCTION

The Association holds meetings in the Methodist Church Hall in Castle Cary, usually on the first Thursday of each month, except in January and August. We invite speakers on subjects of general interest as well as on specific gardening topics. The Annual Show is held in Caryford Community Hall at the beginning of August. But how did it all begin?

Although Flower Shows have been held in Castle Cary for well over a century, the first documented show being c1890, the current Flower Show started in 1949. Our longest serving Officer, Janet Huchfield is now our President, but has served in almost all capacities on the Committee over the years. She remembers that at "One time, just after the war, it was very difficult to know where to stage a flower show. Caryford Hall is an ideal, lovely light place." It has been run every year since 1949, and so 2018 marks the 70th Show.

The location has changed over the years, with the first show being held in a marquee. The name has changed too - from being the Castle Cary Produce Association at its inception, to the Castle Cary Gardening Association today. But the show is still going strong, with many of the same classes and Trophies that were awarded in 1949 still being awarded now. Indeed, one of the more 'modern' Trophies the Coronation Cup, was introduced for the Coronation in 1953. The most recent, the Margaret Bush Trophy, was donated by Norman Bush in memory of his wife, Margaret, for her favourite categories. She had been on the Committee for many years.

Let's hope someone will be celebrating the 100th show in 2048. So make a note in your diaries! If you have any information to fill any of the gaps in the story, please do let us know!

History: Flower Shows of the Past

Extracts from the Castle Cary Visitor:

August 22nd 1889 (Vol 6, p68)

"The first attempt to hold a flower show in connection with the YMCA was on August 22nd, 1889, at the Town Hall. President: John Boyd Secretary: J H Francis"

August 1890 (Vol 6, P 68)

"A second flower Show, on an extended scale, was held in August 1890"

September 1897 (Vol 1, p165)

"Temperance Society. The great attraction in the field (close by "The Pines", North Street) was a Fruit, Flower and Vegetable Show, in a spacious tent, supplied by Mr C Martin. The exhibits were exceedingly good, and by the kindness of Mssrs. J Huntley Thring, J. S Donne, E. Fry, C. W. Hill and F.G Lenon, a large number of beautiful shrubs, plants and ferns were lent for decorative purposes. The Town Band was engaged, and the Yeovil Maypole Dancers performed frequently. Winners in the Wild Flower class were:-Irene Butt Beatrice Litman Lizzie Parsons"

In 1949 the Castle Cary Flower Show started in it's current form.

By the mid-1970's the show had moved to Ansford School. And after a stay at the E P Hall, The Park, it moved to its current home (Caryford Community Hall) in 1995.

Total entries have been healthy in recent years, typically averaging around 6-700 each year, from about 120 competitors. This seems to have been remarkably stable over the years. Within the total, the vegetables, fruit and vegetable classes typically attract 200-300 entries each year. The slight rise in overall entries over the past few years has been led by a resurgence in interest in the handicraft classes.

Of course there have been changes to the schedule classes over the years, but the core classes in the horticultural sections have remained - for example the vegetable collection has existed since the start in various guises.
